Duration	15 months plus end-point assessment
End-point assessment	Multi-choice exam, practical assessment, and an interview underpinned by a portfolio of evidence
Qualification	Level 3 Craft Carpentry and Joinery
Delivery model	Block release (two week block)

This standard aims to give the Apprentice the knowledge, skills and behaviours to successfully complete craft carpentry and joinery tasks and duties.

Day-to-day tasks may include cutting, shaping, and joining wood to create and install building components.

This occupation includes two different options and people will either work on a construction site as an advanced site carpenter or in a workshop as an advanced architectural joiner.
